Discover Milford Cutting, a secluded nature reserve outside Armagh City, with a day packed full of fun and exciting activities for all the family. Have a go at butterfly netting and pond dipping. There will be a wood carving demonstration, guided walks, wildlife games and much more. An unmissable opportunity to enjoy, celebrate and learn more about this old railway cutting, which has recently benefited from improved access, thanks to support from the Big Lottery Fund through BBC Breathing Places. This event is free of charge. Booking is not required.

Directions to Milford Cutting

Take the A3 out of Armagh towards Monaghan and after 2 miles turn left into Milford village, it is signposted. Continue through the village and the nature reserve is situated up a farm track on the left just after the last house of the housing development. Park along the road and walk up this farm track towards the farmyard. Access to the nature reserve is on the right side of the lane just before you reach the farmyard.

Butterfly Survey Workshop, Old School House, Milford

Saturday 31st May 10 am - 2.30 pm

The Ulster Wildlife Trust will be running a workshop on Saturday 31st May, explaining how easy it is to survey butterflies at Milford Cutting. The surveying methods are simple to learn and the surveys at Milford Cutting help to let the Ulster Wildlife Trust know whether their land management techniques are working to enhance wildlife. No experience is necessary, and all training and equipment will be provided.

The workshop will begin with a presentation on the butterflies of Milford Cutting and the methods of recording them, there will time for questions, and after a light lunch there will be a walk to Milford Cutting to see how the system works in practice. This event is free of charge. Booking is required.
